











We hope you enjoyed the challenges and activities around the book 'Giraffes Can't Dance' last week. We have loved seeing the giraffe models you have created.





person and it is so nice to maintain our contact with you. We are nearing the end of term and your photos and videos are making us smile and remind us of the time we spent in school with you.



- Read a book with your child. You can use **Oxford Owl** to access new books at your child's reading level. Oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home
- Practise blending real and alien words by playing 'Buried Treasure' (Phase 3) or segmenting words by playing 'Rocket Rescue' on Phonicsplay.co.uk Username: march20 Password: home
- Play some maths/phonics games on **Educationcity.com** (Subjects/(Mathematics or Literacy)/F2/Activities) We have also added games we would like you to focus on in the homework section.
- Keep practising saying number bonds of 10. (You can use your fingers, a number line or the Numberblocks 'Ten Again' song or our school song to help you)
- Keep practising your current word list.
- Choose 1 Challenge Bingo activity to complete each day.

Please encourage your child to use their sound mat and sound each word out loud so that their writing is phonetically plausible. This is a vital skill to put their phonics into practise. They could even use some of the tricky words they know from their word list.
