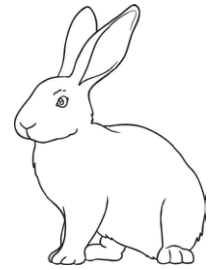

Brown Hare



A brown hare is a small brown mammal with a pale belly and white tail. It is larger than a rabbit with longer legs and longer ears that have a black tip. They can grow to a length of 50 to 70cm and live for up to 4 years. They have been seen all over the UK as far back as Roman times.

Unlike rabbits, hares do not dig burrows (a deep hole in the ground). Instead, they prefer to live in farmland and woodland and make 'forms'. These are shallow holes in the long grass made by the hare laying on the bare earth. To protect themselves, they lie as still as a statue, camouflaged in the grass. If they are disturbed, they can be seen bounding across the fields at high speeds - sometimes up to 45mph.

They are nocturnal creatures, which means they are awake at night, so they can be difficult to notice.

Brown hares are herbivores: they graze on plants and bark of young trees and bushes.
